Young Peoples Sex Education Poll 2022 full report - www.sexeducationforum.uk

A survey of 1,002 young people aged 16-17 in England carried out by Censuswide between 2nd and 13th December 2022, and commissioned by the Sex Education Forum

- 58% of respondents learnt not enough or nothing about pornography
- 56% learnt not enough or nothing about 'how to access local sexual health services'
- 54% learnt not enough or nothing about 'how to tell if a relationship is healthy (including online)
- 54% learnt not enough or nothing about 'sexual orientation including information relevant to people who are LGBTQ+'
 - Over a third (35%) of young people said they wanted more open discussion of issues, ideally discussing/debating real life scenarios.

The Government has announced a review of its guidance for the first time since mandatory RSE was introduced. The Sex Education Forum is hoping that the government will take note of what young people are asking for and that teachers/resources will be put in place to support this work.

Level 1 – free non clinical sexual health update e-learning

Aimed at practitioners working with young people to enhance their understanding of sexual health and to benefit their delivery to young people. For example; teachers, welfare and progress coaches, youth workers, care/support workers, foster carers, vulnerable young person's workers, youth offending teams. It takes approximately 1 hour to complete.

The learning covers Sexual Health Services and how to access them. Contraception. Sexually Transmitted Infections – Consent & the Law – The C Card condom Scheme- Young People and Sexual Health and information about other relevant services and resources.
