Challenges

- Religion, culture and traditions.

- AI/fake information online.
- Gaining the trust of educators in school settings.
- Getting enough teaching time and prioritising the topics into an already overcrowded curriculum.
- Teaching overstretched. Ideally needs a RSHE champion/time for teacher training.
- Less school nursing availability/service.





What can we do - Influencing positive change

- Saying the correct words for body parts
- Openly talking about puberty- ensuring boys learn about girls bodies as well as their own and vice versa age appropriate
- Promoting body positivity- love it /respect it
- Ditch sanitary Talk menstrual
- Age appropriate discuss contraceptives to both males/females reduce the stigma/embarrassment - go condoms !!!
- Acknowledge/talk about hormonal moods testosterone too!!
- Acknowledge menopause -its not a secret society !!
