

HPV Vaccination Survey

The campaign to improve uptake of the HPV vaccination continues. As part of this, University of Leicester are undertaking a research project to understand the role secondary school teachers play in the school-based HPV immunisation programme. The 'Comprehensive HPV Literacy & Communication Model' is an anonymous survey that should take around 15-20 minutes to complete.

Training & Support for RSHE Delivery

C-Card Scheme Update

Calling all local schools and colleges!

The C-Card team is keen to promote awareness of the scheme offering free condoms and sexual health information to young people and adults in Leicester, Leicestershire and Rutland. The Scheme is delivered by trained practitioners in over 150 venues locally, including pharmacies, schools and youth services.



Our approach embeds the importance of delaying sex until young people feel ready and without pressure. We always stress the C-Card has no expiry date, and the products within the pack have long expiry dates (often several years). Along with Julie Eason's offer of RSE training for teachers, the C-Card team offers:

- C-Card training for staff, including best practice when working with under 16s
- Delivery of termly on-site registration events for students in Years 11 to 13. Registration is offered as entirely optional to students and allows them to use their C-Card at local pharmacy venues. We can offer a presentation ahead of the registration event which highlights key messages.
- We also have supplies of condoms for demonstration use in RSHE which we offer to complement awareness and delivery of the C-Card.

Contraceptives Training Boxes & FPA Resources

Do you need resources to support your RSHE curriculum? The FPA has some useful literature available to purchase direct from their website, including some specific leaflets for SEN students.

We also have Contraceptives Display Kits available to borrow, containing excellent visual examples to help make your lessons interesting and engaging. Young people still visit our services with very little understanding or knowledge of menstruation, fertility and contraception.


Respondents gave highest priority to the action 'Provide training for teachers so they can develop more confidence with RSE', with 57% selecting this option.
